This communication report is being sent from Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq People covered by the "Treaties of Peace and Friendship", first signed with the British Crown in 1725. This treaty did not deal with the surrender of lands, but instead was meant to build a relationship between nations.

What's on the go - Update from the Board

Earlier in 2024 the board entered into an MOU with the Town of Mahone Bay to formalize how we're going to work together to increase the number of non-profit co- operative homes in the Mahone Bay area.

The Town and MBCLC are currently collaborating and cost sharing an environmental and topographical analysis ongoing at a property on Hawthorn St to determine whether development is possible on this property. If so, the board will be quickly moving onto the next steps of collaborating with architecture and design experts to determine what kind of development may be possible – as well as pursuing funding.

The Opportunities Committee continues to look for opportunities in Mahone Bay, either land that could be developed or buildings converted to co-operative housing.

The Co-operative Housing Federation of Canada addresses the Committee on Finance

The Co-operative Housing Federation of Canada's Acting Executive Director addressed the House of Commons Standing Committee on Finance on Oct 4th 2024.

Patricia Tessier reminded the committee about the success story of co-operative housing, which offers a "proven solution" to the problems of housing insecurity and social isolation, and where a quarter million Canadians currently live.

Four Key recommendations for the next federal budget were shared with the committee, including the need for the new Cooperative Development Program to "grow in its ambition and finding".

Co-operative Housing is a solid long term response to housing affordability.

A 15 year study comparing co-operative and market housing in five cities documented that: "Co-op rents for 1- and 2-bedroom apartments were found to b approximately 25% below market (between \$150 and \$250 per month difference) in the early part of the study period, and this widened to approximately 33% (reaching \$400 to \$500 difference monthly) in the later years.
